#### **Conference Venue**


The conference will be located at IDHEAP building at Lausanne University.

**From Lausanne Train Station:** Take the Metro M2 at "Lausanne-Gare" in direction to "Sallaz" or "Croisette" and get off at the stop "Lausanne-Flon". Then, take the Metro M1 in direction to "Renens Gare" and get off at the stop "UNIL-Mouline". IDHEAP building is only 200m away.

**From Renens:** In front of the railway station, take the bus n° 31, direction "Venoge Sud/Saint-Sulpice" and get off at the stop "Mouline". IDHEAP building is just on your right.
